PREFECTS

Prefects are appointed from the Leaving Certificate class. They are responsible, respectful, good role models and individuals who act as leaders within the school. They help First Year students make a successful transition into their new school environment.

Transition Year provides a broad educational experience, leading to increased maturity, before proceeding to the Leaving Certificate Cycle.

- It helps students take greater responsibility for their own decisions
- Its wide-ranging syllabus is reviewed annually and is tailored to suit the needs and interests of the students
- All Transition Year students are encouraged to complete the European Computer Driving Licence (ECDL) & Computer Coding
- Transition Years produce a Drama/Musical each year to display their multitude of talents
- Emphasis is placed on the spoken and aural languages
- All students are encouraged to develop their skills and talents by entering competitions
- The Programme also includes opportunities for work experience and student exchange



PARENT ASSOCIATION


- It is a representative body established by the parents/guardians of our students
